# Yampa Valley Medical Center

More than 100 years ago in Steamboat Springs, a hospital was born. In its earliest incarnation, six physicians, one surgeon and one nurse came together to care for patients.

Today, Yampa Valley Medical Center (YVMC) is a 39-bed acute care hospital providing sophisticated medical services to more than 51,000 outpatients annually, along with expertly managing more than 8,000 emergency visits and 3,400 surgeries. YVMC is a non-profit, non-tax-supported community hospital that is dedicated to serving residents and visitors throughout northwest Colorado.

YVMC's historical commitment to the people of Routt County and beyond features several transformations through the years to meet contemporary healthcare needs and demand. The current hospital building opened in 1999. A \$13 million renovation and expansion project was completed in 2010 to create the Birth Center and surgical care space. The Gloria Gossard Center was developed four years later.

The medical center employs close to 600 people who work together to deliver the highest quality medical care with an excellent patient experience. Patients and visitors to the Yampa Valley have access to specialty care, including a Level III trauma center and a Level II special Care Nursery, as well as clinical services in women's care, heart and vascular care, cardiac rehabilitation, sports medicine rehabilitation and endocrinology. UCHealth Jan Bishop Cancer Center provides a variety of advanced cancer care services administered by specially trained oncology-certified nurses and board-certified oncologists.

Beyond the attention to the latest and most advanced medicine, we are proud of the compassion with which our professionals provide care. A medical staff of nearly 100 physicians representing 32 specialties utilize the most current technologies and treatment advances, while never losing sight of the importance and dignity of each individual patient.

### **Re-Imagining our Emergency Department**

Significant transformations in health care have occurred over the last decades. Privacy, efficiency, safety, and the provision of a superior healing environment has been emphasized at medical facilities across the country. In recent years, hospitals have been particularly diligent in the area of emergency services renovation and modernization, creating new spaces that vastly improve the experience for patients, family and care providers.

YVMC's Emergency Department opened when the hospital did, making it nearly 20 years old. It is the patient satisfaction component, and the unparalleled care provided in the ED as well as our Level III trauma center designation that continue to affirm YVMC as the leader in Emergency Care in the Northwest Colorado area. According to the American Trauma Society, YVMC's ED has demonstrated the ability to provide prompt assessment, resuscitation, surgery, intensive care and stabilization of injured patients and emergency operations. The ED has 24/7 coverage by boardcertified emergency medicine physicians and retains on-call specialists, including surgeons and anesthesiologists, among others, to deliver a multidisciplinary, team approach to care. Though the hospital boasts some of it's best patient satisfaction scores from the emergency department, the treatment rooms and corridors are undersized, privacy is lacking and access is sometimes compromised.

Now is the time to bring our attention to the ED facilities. Together, along with the distinctive and respected care of its staff, YVMC can continue to provide its extraordinary patient care into the future.



The modernized ED at YVMC will be a model of emergency services sophistication, designed for the comfort of today's patient and family, for the accommodation of contemporary technology and for the efficient of care provided by clinicians and staff, and for the most important benefit – enhanced outcomes.



*Better Work Flow and Safety* –Improved layout of the emergency department will provide an enormous advantage for patients and staff alike. There will be an open, centralized work core and immediate adjacency to CT, MRI and Radiology. Nurses will be better able to observe all patients, including those with behavioral health needs.

*New Trauma Room* – Among the many benefits will be a new technologically advanced trauma room for patients in critical situations.

**Separate ambulance and walk-in entry** – Improving access and flow for both ambulance and walk-in patients will result in less congestion and increased privacy.



*Additional space, comfort, convenience and flexibility* – Each room will be spacious and private with sliding glass doors. Featured in each space will be embedded and wall-mounted medical equipment, telemedicine capability, and room for family and friends to be with the patient.

The ultimate goal of this project is to create an ED that is spacious, comforting, convenient, modern and medically sophisticated, all the while creating a healing environment. The intentional flexibility of the space will address shifting emergency services populations and care needs. The end result will be a better patient experience.
